Dear Parents,

Wolf Creek is committed to providing the highest quality of education for every tiger. In order to meet the academic and behavioral needs of all of our students, Wolf Creek has begun implementing Response to Intervention. Response to Intervention (RTI) is a multi-grade-level approach to providing differentiated support for all students. To determine if students are meeting grade-level expectations, every child will be screened three to five times a year on STAR 360 as well as other reading measures such as Literacy First and NSGRA. Wolf Creek staff will use the data to find both strengths and weaknesses and provide a variety of approaches to ensure each of our tigers are successful.

We have completed our initial assessments for all of our Kindergarten – 5th grade students. This data is one of the important items we would like to share with parents at the upcoming Fall Parent Teacher Conferences. Conferences are scheduled for Thursday, October 11th from 4 to 8 pm and Tuesday, October 16th from 4 to 8 pm. I strongly encourage you to attend this important conference in order to learn more about your child’s educational progress.

Have you heard of the Tiger Challenge? The Tiger Challenge is our way of teaching our students various life skills throughout the year. In August and September, we concentrated on teaching our tigers the life skill of being tenacious. Last week each homeroom teacher nominated two students from their class that has shown this skill. Friday, October 5th Wolf Creek honored all the nominated Tenacious Tigers with a Ron’s party. Thank you Mrs. Franklin for arranging donation for our Tenacious Party.
